The band then became The Rogues and were not affiliated with group of the same name in Martinsville, VA and then became The Avengers not to be confused with group of the same name in Grifton, NC that went on to become The Band of Oz. The band names were just a coincidence. This band played some beach songs that included: "Under the Boardwalk," "I've Been Hurt" (Tams' version), "Lipstick Traces" (O'Jays version)," "Hey Baby," and "Double Shot." Authors note: There was at least one other band called the Rogues (Athens) in Georgia, and probably countless bands called the Barons. It's a good thing the Barons turned Rogues turned Avengers didn't want to call themselves the Villagers, because there were at least three of those in South Carolina alone. We hope to soon know what version of "Hey, Baby" the Barons turned Rouges, turned Avengers played back in the late '60s. Was it the one with the harmonica riff of Delbert McClinton or did the band start out playing "39-21-40 shape and it evolved into a horn supported, "Hey,
