<b>Brief Description</b>	The Cavaliers were a well known and established group out of Dunn, N C, under the management of Harry Driver. In 1965, the group added Campbell College student, Gene Barbour , who paired with N C State band members Donald Hobson and Billy Wellons, anchoring the group that produced "Nobody" the most sought after recording in the legendary JCP catalog (JCP 1020), and a song that routinely fetches \$600-700 bids for original copies of the 45 RPM.
