Other songs performed included: <i>In the Midnight Hour</i> , <i>Ain't to Proud to Beg</i> , Billy Stewart's <i>Summertime</i> , <i>Walk on By</i> , <i>Monkey Time</i> , <i>Hold on I'm Comin'</i> , a medley of <i>Hey Baby/Blue Moon</i> and so on in this genre. The Consouls roamed NC, SC and GA in a dark green Chevrolet panel truck. The band's name in bright yellow adorned both sides. The appellation "soul truck" was lettered above the side windows.
