It was originally released on the local Lamar label. These Villagers, which lasted from 1963 to 1966, also featured Kent Mims, Steve Mims and Merle Warner on vocals, Charles Stafford on bass, and Amy Whitaker on lead guitar, a real rarity for the time. The group had it's origins in The Nomads, Duprees and Marquis, and eventually spawned both The Persians and Footnotes, a group that continues recording today.
