The integrated Weejuns group issued their first single "If You Say Goodbye" in 1963. That was followed by a cover of Arthur Alexander's WHERE HAVE YOU BEEN ALL MY LIFE, in 1966, complete with picture sleeve, a real rarity for Beach acts in the 60's.
